


<p>Many with fingernail on pointing finger and often with thumb to one side of the pointing finger. Dots commonly for design but also on the skin – signs of illness? – With several cuff designs. Hands very elongated, almost forming wedge shapes in which the hand terminates in a point where it meets the cuff.</p>	<p>Consistent pattern of design that is distinct from the types seen in Sample A. No fingernail examples. No dots. A different design of the thumb. Above all the shape of the hand itself is different, with these being much shorter and not coming together in a point at the cuff.</p>
